We introduced our own Bachelor of Laws Honours degree in 2009, which has received full accreditation from the Malaysian Qualifications Agency, and recognition from the Malaysian Legal Profession Qualifying Board.

Both programmes incorporate a variety of teaching and learning methods and activities, both academic and practical, which strive to ensure that our students receive an integrated education. ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

MUET Band 4

- A pass in STPM, with a minimum Grade C (GP 2.0) in any TWO (2) subjects; or any equivalent qualification; OR
- A pass in Sijil Tinggi Agama Malaysia (STAM) with a minimum grade of Jayyid (good); OR
- Any qualifications equivalent to Diploma (Level 4, MQF); or any equivalent qualification; OR
- Matriculation/Foundation qualification with a minimum CGPA of 2.0 out of 4.0; or any equivalent qualification.
- * All results must be obtained in ONE EXAMINATION SITTING as stipulated by the Malaysian Legal Profession Qualifying Board. A credit in Bahasa Melayu at SPM is required for students intending to practise Law in Malaysia as required by the Malaysian Legal Profession Qualifying Board. For JPA recognition, students must have completed their CLP.

LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENT

International students are required to have a score of: 600 for Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), OR 100 for online TOEFL test, OR

6.0 for International English Language Testing System (IELTS) OR its equivalent

PROGRAMME DETAILS

- 2 hours of lectures and 1 hour of tutorials per week for each subject with additional 32 hours of blended-learning activities in a long semester (17 weeks)
- 3 hours of workshop per week for a practical subject in a long semester (17 weeks)
- 6 hours of workshop per week for practical subjects in a short semester (9 weeks)
- 3 semesters per academic year with two (2) long semester (17 weeks) and one (1) short semester (9 weeks)






